Regular Town Board Meeting September 26, 2017

Supervisor Votra opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance at 10:00 AM.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Robinson and seconded by Councilwoman Tremper to approve the minutes of the Public Hearing for Local Law 02-2017 held on August 29, 2017 as submitted by the Town Clerk. *All in favor*.

CEO Report:

CEO McGill reported he attended the monthly St. Lawrence County Code Officerøs meeting and the subject of arc fault breakers was discussed. New York State is pushing for these and there may be more information going forward. Outlet locations were also discussed at the meeting.

A motion was made by Councilman Sweeney and seconded by Councilwoman Tremper to accept the Code Enforcement Officer report as submitted and to be filed with the Town Clerk.

Assessor's Report:

Assessor McGill reported a busier office with the school taxes being mailed out this month. There were a lot of questions and concerns about STAR as well as the usual questions and concerns about reassessments and land sales.

Privilege of the Floor:

Business:

 A proposed resolution has been received from the Adirondack Association of Towns and Villages which is the Constitutional Amendment for Health and Safety Land Bank.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Tremper and seconded by Councilman Cook to adopt Resolution 03-2017 as follows:

TOWN OF PARISHVILLE, NEW YORK RESOLUTION 03-2017

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING STATEWIDE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT BALLOT PROPOSAL #3 THAT CREATES A LAND ACCOUNT TO ADDRESS SPECIFIC PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY CONCERNS FOR USE BY TOWNS, VILLAGES, AND COUNTIES HAVING NO VIABLE ALTERNATIVE OTHER THAN USING FOREST PRESERVE LAND.

WHEREAS, the NY State Forest Preserve lands, in many instances, border local and state highways where local government needs to use a portion of land to straighten a dangerous road, replace a culvert to prevent floods, create a safer bike path, drill a water supply well, or install broadband and other critical infrastructure, and

WHEREAS, the proposed Amendment will create a land account with up to 250-acres of State Forest Preserve land eligible for use by towns, villages, and counties that have no viable alternative to using State Forest Preserve land to address specific public health or safety concerns, and

WHEREAS, as in exchange for the land removed from the State Forest Preserve, another 250-acres of land, will be added to the State Forest Preserve, subject to NY State legislative approval, and

WHEREAS, the proposed Amendment also will allow bicycle trails and certain public utility lines to be located within the width of specific highways that cross the State Forest Preserve while minimizing removal of trees and vegetation, and

WHEREAS, the NY State Constitution has been amended to allow such projects in the past, requiring approval by two separately elected NY State Legislatures and a Statewide Referendum, and

WHEREAS, there exists currently a NYS DOT landbank for NY State road projects which has a long- standing record of success, and

WHEREAS, if approved by the voters of New York State, Ballot Proposal #3 would eliminate the time-consuming and costly bureaucratic process for completing important road maintenance, utility installation and bicycle path creation projects in the Adirondacks and Catskills, a process not faced by communities in any other region of New York State, and

WHEREAS, the Amendment has wide bi-partisan support from local governments, environmental protection organizations, business groups, recreational enthusiasts, and others for two simple reasons; Itos for public good and itos rooted in plain old common sense, and

WHEREAS, this Amendment represents the best possible solution to long standing or continuing issues, which local government leaders have work for many years to resolve, and

WHEREAS, Ballot Proposal #3 on November 7, 2017 warrants the support of all the voters of New York State.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Parishville Town Board does hereby support Ballot Proposal #3 on November 7, 2017, which is deemed critically important to our communities, the State Forest Preserve, the environment and the People of the State of New York, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution shall be forwarded to NYSAC and the Adirondack Association of Towns and Villages.

Privilege of the Floor:

Luke Dailey would like to remind everyone that the wind project is still an issue even though the local law has been passed. She expressed concern that next year¢s budget should reflect an increase to allow for more legal costs. Ms. Dailey would like to send the Parishville Town Wind Law on behalf of the CCRP to the attorney they have retained to review the law. This attorney is already being paid and will cost the town no money. She also wanted to remind everyone that this is the last week for public comments on the St. Lawrence Foothills Management Plan with the DEC. Ms. Dailey left a copy with the Town Clerk in case anyone is interested in the 3 State forests in the Town of Parishville. Corey Sheldon introduced himself and said he was running for the Town Council in November. Steve Hart also introduced himself and said he will be running for the position of Highway Superintendent in November.

Fred Wilhelm said the Parishville Planning Board will be meeting and reviewing the Land Use and Development Code with revisions being made possibly in January. They will be researching the solar issues that seem to be coming.

David Russell asked if the Town still intends to buy the trailer and land on State Route 72 in the hamlet. Supervisor Votra stated that the Town was willing to purchase this at the agreed upon price of \$10,000.00 and were not interested in paying more than that at this time.

A motion was made by Councilman Sweeney and seconded by Councilwoman Robinson to adjourn the meeting at 10:17 AM.
